All bills and supplier invoice payments where possible are made by BACS payment and are made in a timely manner

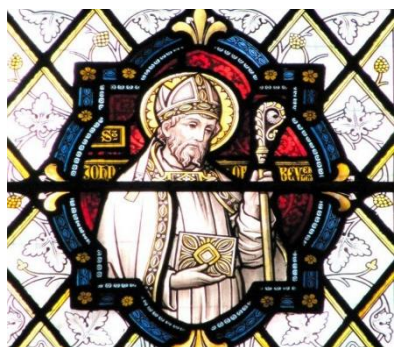
Both, the accounts and Gift Aid, and the Gift Aid claim have been prepared and submitted after all the accounts have been reconciled.

SAINTS THIS WEEK

St John of Beverley (Tuesday 7th May)



St John of Beverley was a monk of Whitby and was consecrated Bishop of Hexham in about 687. In 705 he was translated to the see of York.

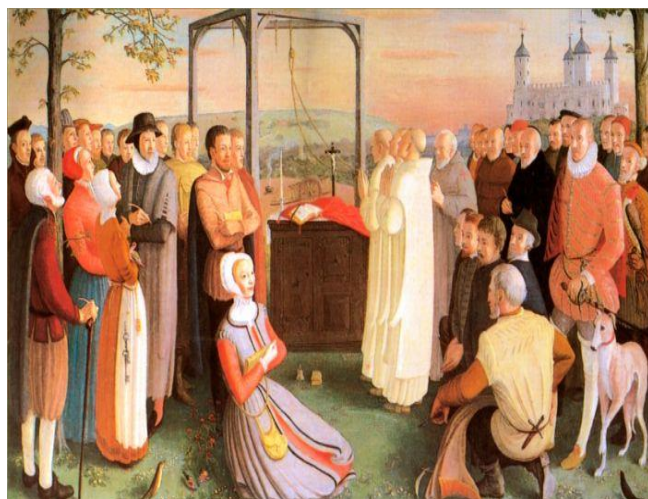
He built a monastery at Beverley to which, as an old man, he retired on resigning his see. He died on 7th May in 721 and was buried in the Minster. He was canonised in 1037.

The English Martyrs (Saturday 4th May)

The English Men and Women martyred for the Catholic Faith 1535-1680 and beatified by the Holy See. On this day in 1535 three Carthusian monks died at Tyburn, the first of many martyrs of the English reformation.

Of these martyrs, 42 have been canonised and a further 242 have been declared blessed. However the number of those who died on the scaffold, perished in prison, or suffered harsh persecution for their faith in the course of a century and a half cannot now be reckoned. They came from every walk of life;

rich and poor, married and single, women and men. They are remembered for the example they gave of constancy in their faith, and courage in the face of persecution.
