

#### **EASTER REFLECTION**

The joy of our faith and hope rests in the words of Jesus to Martha before He raised Lazarus from the dead: "I am the resurrection and the life: he that believeth in me, although he be dead, shall live; and every one that liveth, and believeth in me, shall not die for ever" (John 11:25-26). Let us join our voices to Martha's as we echo her response to Jesus: "Yes, Lord, I have believed that thou art Christ, the Son of the living God" (John 11:27). Easter not only is the foundation of our faith, Easter also invigorates our hope. Hope draws our eyes upward, where God resides. Saint Paul encourages us: "Therefore, if you be risen with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is sitting at the right hand of God. Mind the things that are above, not the things that are upon the earth. For you are dead and your life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ shall appear, who is your life, then you also shall appear with Him in glory" (Colossians 3:1-4). While Christmas and Easter both have Octaves, the Church celebrates the Easter season for a longer period than it does Christmas. "Eastertide" extends to 50 days, and commemorates the 40 days Our Lord spent on earth after His Resurrection to the time of His Ascension into Heaven, as well as the 10 days from the Ascension to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

#### **FIELD NOTES**

TODAY IS KNOWN AS GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY because, in each year of the liturgical cycle on this 4th Sunday, the Gospel is always taken from the 10th chapter of St John where Jesus speaks of himself as the "good shepherd".

The shepherd image conveys the personal relationship between Jesus and his followers; it portrays the care of the shepherd for the sheep. He has gone looking for the one sheep that wandered off and having found it, takes it over his shoulders back to the flock. There is a close bond between the shepherd and this one sheep. He knows his own and his own know him, just as the Father knows him and he knows the Father. When it comes to the Lord we are not just one of a crowd, lost in a sea of humanity. The Lord knows each one of us by name. He relates to us in a personal way and he invites us to relate to him in a personal way. When Jesus says that, as the good shepherd, 'I lay down my life for my sheep', he is saying that he lays down his life for each one of us individually.

Today is also Vocations Sunday. From the time of our baptism, we are each called to be the Lord's disciples, to follow the good Shepherd. However, the way we do that will be unique to each one of us. Each of us has a unique contribution to make to the Lord's work in the world, to the life of the church, and our input is just as vital as anyone else's. We each have a unique calling and each one of us is vitally important to the Lord.

On this Vocations Sunday we can ask what the Good Shepherd wants of us right here, right now. All that is needed is to stop and to listen. Listen to some the beautiful words of Scripture, or just attend to the silent presence of God. "Let me hear what God the Lord will speak, for he will speak peace to his people, to his saints, to those who turn to him in their heart" (Ps. 85:8). No matter where we are, we can open our hearts, minds to his voice that speaks of peace.

One final thought on shepherding. Anthropologists tell us that between the hunting and the farming stages of cultural development, shepherds stood as a people who existed in both worlds and tied them together. For that reason, shepherds appear in ancient myths and sagas as a symbol for the divine unity of opposites. What the ancient pagans hinted at, Christian faith has brought into a crisp reality with Jesus Christ as the great reconciler. He is the Good Shepherd, who has come into the centre of every great conflict in order to establish beauty, unity and peace and we can be a part of it.
