

Outside Easter Time the Paschal Candle should not be kept in the sanctuary nor should it be lit, except for the celebrations of Baptism and funerals.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION - SUNDAY 18 JULY 9-30AM

Y4 and Y5 Catholic Pupils – 1st Holy Communion Preparation
I am delighted to advise that we now have a date for the celebration of First Holy
Communion - Sunday 18 July 9.30am at Good Shepherd Mytholmroyd and
11.00am Sacred Heart & St Patrick's Church Sowerby Bridge.

If your child is a baptised Catholic, has made their First Confession, they can continue their sacramental journey by making First Communion - Due to the pandemic, the Sacrament will be celebrated by the children in both Y4 and Y5.

Communion Workshops for CHILDREN from both parishes will be held at Sacred Heart Voluntary Academy Sowerby Bridge. The session will last about 1 hr.

REGARDING THE CHANGES TO THE LAW CONCERNING THE REGISTRATION OF MARRIAGES

General Register Office (GRO) A brief summary of the changes are that:

- 1) There will no longer be any "blue forms" issued to the couple by the Registry Office. Marriages will be registered solely by the Register Office electronically.
- 2) Instead the couple will be issued with a "Marriage Schedule" a similar but slightly different document from the previous form.
- 3) On the wedding day, the only document to be signed is this Marriage Schedule (Marriage Registers will no longer be used).
- 4) The signed and completed Marriage Schedule is then to be returned to the Registry Office within 21 days. This is a legal duty.
- 5) After 04 May 2021 only the Registry Office can issue any Marriage Certificates
- 6) There will no longer be any Bound Registers. These Registers are to be closed from 04 May. Marriage Registers and any unused Certificates must be returned to Calderdale Register Office, Spring Hall, Huddersfield Rd.

FIELD NOTES In these days that lead from the Ascension to Pentecost the scriptures become a meditation on Christ's continuing presence with his people in the Church. The Acts of the Apostles, in recalling the election of Matthias to take the place of Judas, reminds us of a Church that is constantly renewed despite human infirmity. Peter clearly outlined the qualities that would be necessary. "We must therefore choose someone who has been with us the whole time that the Lord was travelling around with us, someone who was with us from the time when John was baptising until the day when he was taken up from us." Although Peter's words referred specifically to the apostle who would take Judas's place, they can be taken in a more general sense to describe the fulfilment of every Christian life. The defining quality of the apostle would be his closeness to the Lord. He would have been with the Lord Jesus from the very beginning, one whose every action would flow from this intimate bond between the master and his disciple.

As Christians we share this same calling in different ways. Our lives as Christians in the family, the Church and society, will be fruitless unless they are rooted in this familiar communion with the Lord. Through prayer and the holy sacraments, we begin to live the presence of God in our world. What we do may, or may not, impress the world. The only thing that truly matters is that through us the presence of Christ begins to touch the world. This is quite impossible if we remain strangers in his presence. At the deepest level our lives are rooted in God's life. We live not for ourselves, but as those who have been entrusted by the Father to the Son. The unfolding of our days, haphazard though it seems, is lived out beneath a loving providence.

"I kept those you have given me true to your name. I have watched over them and not one is lost, except the one who chose to be lost."

Prayer links us to the communion described by Jesus. Here we find the belonging that makes sense of our lives. Only from this communion would the disciples be enabled to face the inevitable conflicts that their ministry would bring.

"I passed your word on to them, and the world hated them because they belong to the world no more than I belong to the world."

The "world" to which Jesus refers is a world turned in on itself. In its fruitless search for belonging it surrenders itself to its own self- indulgence, measuring everything in terms of its own satisfaction. This is not the world created by God. When we allow the prayer of Jesus to speak to our hearts, we are faced with a decision that will inform all the choices that life brings. Do we choose the life-giving communion that has called our lives into being, or do we serve the contradictions of a divided world? Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, Jesus sends us into such a world. It is through our communion with him that we bring healing to our world.
