STAGE FOUR OF LOCKDOWN EASING ON 21 JUNE

For what it is worth, my view is that the PM will be choosing to delay full unlocking. At the moment the R-number is already at 1.6, this is higher than late December 2020. Also, the more significant characteristic of the Delta variant is that one vaccine dose is effective against it, though two doses provides good protection. And that good protection takes 2 or 3 weeks to develop after the second dose. So with all vulnerable groups targeted to have both doses by 21 June, the PM would want to add a fortnight to that date before fully unlocking. Also another fortnight of data will help see if the increase infections are translating into significantly increased hospitalisations.

Be reassured that I will continue to follow the guidance from the diocese and the government. We will not rush to unlock; we will be cautious moving forward.

FIELD NOTES

The growth of plants, trees, flowers and grass, takes place very quietly and slowly, without our knowing. This growth permeates three of the four readings for this Sunday.

Today Jesus speaks about the mystery of growth. A farmer scatters seed on the good soil of Galilee. Having done the sowing, all he can do is attend to other things, while the seed takes over and does its own work, producing first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear, until the crop is ready for harvest. In the parable the farmer does not know how all this happens. Between his actions of sowing the seed and harvesting the crop nature takes over in a way that he does not fully understand. There is a great deal in our world which we do not fully understand, in spite of the great progress over the centuries on all aspects of science.

There is a reassuring message here for any who are discouraged by the slow progress of goodness in the world. The spreading of God's reign is ultimately the work of God... and that work is going on even when we do not see it or understand it. We have a part to play, just as the farmer has a role to play in the coming of the final harvest. However, that first parable in the gospel warns us against overestimating our role. St Paul expresses this perspective well, 'Neither the one who plants, nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth.'

The second parable in today's gospel reminds us that God can be at work in surprising ways and places. There is a stark contrast between the tiny mustard seed... Insignificant beginnings can lead to a wonderful result. The kingdom of God is like that; it often is expressed initially in what is small and seemingly insignificant. We can feel that our own faith is as small as a mustard seed. Jesus assures us that the Spirit is working in and through such faith. Our various efforts can seem to bear very insignificant results. The parable assures us that the final harvest from those efforts will be abundant.

We must learn to be content with the small contribution that we ourselves can make towards a better world. The kingdom of God is being worked out in quiet and humble ways. We need to learn to appreciate little things and small gestures. We may not have to be heroes or martyrs, but we are called to put a little dignity into our own little corner of the world. There are little seeds of the kingdom that all of us can sow, a friendly gesture towards someone in trouble, a welcoming smile for someone who is alone. We must never forget that it is the Lord who sows, the Lord who waters, the Lord who reaps the harvest. We are merely servants in the vineyard.
