SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATIONS - ATTENDANCE AT MASS ON

CONFIRMATION - THURSDAY 15 JULY AT 7:30PM Sacred Heart and St. Patrick Church **FIRST HOLY COMMUNION** - SUNDAY 18 JULY 09.30AM Good Shepherd.

Due to the fact that the Covid restrictions continue until 19 July 2021 the Mass for Confirmation and First Holy Communion will have to be restricted to only those receiving Confirmation and Fist Holy Communion. The limit on attendance is the safe capacity of the Church building in our case 30. Thank you for your understanding and for putting our children first – please make other arrangements for THURSDAY 15 JULY AT 7:30PM and for SUNDAY 18 JULY 09.30AM – thank you.

DIOCESE OF LEEDS The PM has delayed the lifting of all Covid restrictions to 19 July 2021. The following guidance assumes that the established diocesan requirements for churches to be open are in place. In particular, the maximum safe operating capacity of the church (in our case 30) must continue to be observed. The limit on attendance at Weddings & Funerals is the safe capacity of the Church building.

Face Coverings are required by law to be worn in places of worship. The presiding celebrant in the sanctuary, providing they are sufficiently distant (2m or more) from the congregation, does not need to wear a face covering.

Social Distancing and the Limitation on Numbers Attending Mass In the Diocese of Leeds, the following guidance should be maintained: The 2m social distancing requirements should be applied wherever possible. Good ventilation of the sacred space (especially during and between services) remains important.

Managing Church Access Parishes should continue to operate the registration arrangements which they have in place for those wishing to attend the celebration of Mass and at liturgies where the numbers may need to continue to be restricted to the safe capacity of the church. QR Codes & Booking systems for liturgies should be in place. Congregational Singing, Choirs and Music Indoor congregational singing remains prohibited.

The Communion Rite The physical exchange of a Sign of Peace remains suspended at this time. This will be kept under review.

Cleaning of Churches General cleaning to a good standard, using generally available cleaning fluids, with attention to frequent touchpoints is the standard to continue. If someone has tested positive for Covid-19 who has used your church premises in the last 24 hours, and you are aware of this, then you should ensure the building is cleaned thoroughly using ordinary detergents. That does **NOT** mean a "deep clean", which is not necessary. **REMEMBER**, if your health is not good and you are vulnerable, if you have a cough or cold or temperature you should stay at home.

FIELD NOTES The image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help is an icon, painted on wood, and seems to have originated around the thirteenth century. Traditionally, the image is also known as "Our Lady of Perpetual Succour." The icon (about 54 x 41.5 cm) depicts our Blessed Mother Mary, under the title "Mother of God," holding the Child Jesus.

The influence of Eastern icons in the West, around the 12th and 13th centuries brought a class of icons called Cardiotissa, from the Greek word kardia, meaning heart. Cardiotissa means "having a heart" or showing sympathy and mercy and compassion. In them the face of Our Lady appears full of sorrow, yet supremely dignified in her contemplation of the sufferings of her Son. His passion is represented by angels holding instruments of His passion, most often the cross, the lance, the sponge and the nails. The Our Lady of Perpetual Help icon is of this type.

Some commentators on colour claim that bluish purple became the colour of penance in the Western Church (during Lent and Advent) because purple is a combination of blue and red. The blue reminds us of heaven, to which we wish to arrive by our penance, and the red recalls martyrdom, because all penance requires a dying to oneself. The archangels Gabriel and Michael wore tunics of purple since they carry the instruments of the passion and death of Christ. The figures of the icon are identified with abbreviations of their names and Mary is designated by her chief title to glory: Mother of God.

The Archangels Michael and Gabriel, hovering in the upper corners, hold the instruments of the Passion– St. Michael (in the left corner) holds the spear, the wine-soaked sponge, and the crown of thorns, and St. Gabriel (in the right corner) holds the cross and the nails. The intent of the artist was to portray the Child Jesus contemplating the vision of His Future Passion. Nevertheless, the icon also conveys the triumph of Christ over sin and death, symbolized by the golden background (a sign of the glory of the resurrection) and the manner in which the angels hold the instruments, i.e. like trophies gathered up from Calvary on Easter morning.

In a very beautiful way, the Child Jesus grasps the hand of the Blessed Mother. He seeks comfort from His mother, as He sees the instruments of His passion. The position of Mary's hands— both holding the Child Jesus (who seems like a small adult) and presenting Him to us— convey the reality of our Lord's incarnation, that He is true God who became also true man. In iconography, Mary here is the one who guides us to the Redeemer. She also is our Help, who intercedes on our behalf with her Son. The star painted on Mary's veil, centred on her forehead, highlights her role in the plan of salvation as both the Mother of God and our Mother

According to tradition, after Napoleon's troops destroyed the Church of St. Matthew in 1812, the image was transferred to the Church of St. Mary in Posterula, which stands at the south end of the Ponte Umberto and remained there for nearly forty years. There, the image was neglected and forgotten.

By divine providence, the forgotten image was rediscovered. In 1866, Saint Pope Pius IX entrusted the image to the Redemptorists, who had just built the Church of St. Alphonsus, on the Via Merulana, a short distance from St. Mary Major, in the city of Rome. To this day, the Church of St. Alphonsus displays the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help and welcome pilgrims for prayer. May each of us never hesitate to invoke the prayers and intercession of Our Blessed Mother in time of need.
