

#### **GUIDANCE ON COVID AFTER THE 19 JULY**

With the lifting of most Coronavirus restrictions, the Bishops have issued guidance we have been asked to take things steadily, so that by late September 2021, we will comfortably be less restricted than we are now. The Bishops have decided that the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation will be brought back for the First Sunday of Advent 2021.

I would ask you all to continue to use the online booking to attend the 9.30am Sunday Mass (Max capacity of 40) and weekday details will still be taken at the door for as long as the NHS app is active. Also, we will continue to have one-way systems in church. Face Coverings no longer be mandatory but a mask would be a good idea in indoor settings. Hand sanitiser still available for people to use.

**Limitation on Numbers** increase from **30-40** / Good ventilation important.

Managing Church Access continue to use online booking system and register at the door.

**Congregational Singing** - to be kept under review.

**The Communion Rite** - the Sign of Peace remains suspended.

**Stewards** - a valuable sign of hospitality

#### **FIELD NOTES**

The Priest, standing at the altar, takes the paten with the bread and holds it slightly raised above the altar with both hands, saying:

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life.

Today's gospel opens with the Jews complaining about Jesus. As far as they were concerned his ordinariness was a problem. This is the son of Joseph, the carpenter from Nazareth; they knew his family and his mother. Yet, here he was claiming to be the bread that came down from heaven. They were scandalized that one of their own could make such claim:

I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

In the beginning, when he first met the group of disciples gathered by John the Baptist he invited them to, 'Come and see.' They came, they saw how he lived, and eventually came to believe in him. He urges those who already believe to come closer to him and deepen that love for him. We are always on the way towards him, the Lord keeps calling on us to come closer.

Jesus calls himself the bread that comes down from heaven and calls us to eat this Holy bread of eternal life. The Lord invites us come to him and to feed on his presence, and to feed on his most Holy word. In the Jewish Scriptures bread is often a symbol of the Holy word of God. We may be familiar with the quotation from the Jewish Scriptures, 'we do not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.' The food of his word will sustain us on our journey through life, just as, in the first reading, the baked scones sustained Elijah, until he reached his destination, the mountain of God. In the most Holy Eucharist, this is where we receive the bread of life and are united to Christ, believing and listening to him. If our communion with him is real, we have his own life within us and it will be something beautiful to be hold. Without this frequent return to the bread of life it is difficult to keep the spirit of Christ alive in our hearts. The most Holy Eucharist is the source of re-creation, a source of new life in us. Here we find new inspiration and vision through the Word of God and the body of Christ. Here we can have our faith renewed and here we are given the strength to live it out.
