## **FROM PARISH TO MISSION AND THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS 2021 – 2023**

### **FACILITATORS WILL VISIT OUR PARISH ON TUESDAY 16 NOVEMBER AT 7PM**

On 10 October 2021, Pope Francis formally opened a two-year process called ‘a synod on synodality,’ officially known as ‘Synod 2021-2023: For a Synodal Church.’ In brief, the process entails bishops around the world consulting with all the baptised before coming together for a gathering of bishops in October 2023. This process also marks the beginning of our own diocesan process of consultation, From Parish to Mission. As a major part of that consultation, volunteer facilitators will visit every parish in the diocese from the beginning of November to lead an open meeting to consider the questions put by the Holy See.

A team of volunteer facilitators will visit our parish on **Tuesday 16 November at 7pm**. Do come along to the meeting. If you are unable to attend or if you would rather engage with the process online, you can complete an online questionnaire at

**The Ten Questions** In order to help highlight the experiences and contribute to the consultation, see below ten themes to explore taken from the preparatory document (Synod 2021 - 2023).

#### **I. The journeying companions**

As we journey together let us look around. Who are you on the journey with and what persons or groups are marginalised and why?

#### **II. Listening**

How might our local Church better listen to lay people (and especially young people and women) and minorities and those who are not respected?

#### **III. Speaking out**

How can everybody be encouraged to communicate appropriately what is important to them?

#### **IV. Celebrating**

How might I be better able to participate in Mass and other liturgies?

## **V. Co-responsible in the mission**

How can each Baptised person become a “missionary disciple”, revealing Christ to others through their words and deeds?

## **VI. Dialogue in Church and society**

How might we improve our conversations within our diocesan family and also outside of it, (for example with people of different faiths, those who have no faith and those who have particular roles and duties in society)?

## **VII. With the other Christian denominations**

Are our relations with our Christian brothers and sisters good? How might they be improved?

## **VIII. Authority and participation**

How might we develop teamwork and a sense of co-responsibility in our local Church?

## **IX. Discerning and deciding**

How might we improve the process of decision-making in our local Church, so that we truly listen and recognise that the Holy Spirit can speak through each one of us?

## **X. Forming ourselves in synodality**

What formation is necessary within the local Church if we are to become better at listening to one another and sharing our insights with one another?

**FIELD NOTES** We celebrate this great feast of All Saints. It is important to emphasise from the beginning what we mean here by 'saints'. Normally we apply the word to people of extraordinary holiness who have been canonised or beatified by the Church. Among them we have favourites: St Lucy, St Linus, St Chrysogonus, Ss Felicity and Perpetua and on. But today's feast refers to all those baptised Christians who have died and are now with God in glory. It also certainly includes all who lived a good life sincerely in accordance with the convictions of their conscience. We simply do not know how many people we are talking about but it must be a very large number.

The Gospel for today's feast is remarkable. It gives us what we know as the Eight Beatitudes from the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount. It is, in fact, a charter for holiness. The Beatitudes go far beyond the Ten Commandments in what they expect of a follower of Christ and yet one hears of relatively few Christians saying that they base their lives on the Beatitudes. When we go to Confession it is the Ten Commandments we normally refer to and not the Beatitudes. It is clear from their position in Matthew's gospel that the Beatitudes have a central place.

The word 'blessed' is sometimes translated 'happy'. It might be more accurate to translate it as 'fortunate'. In other words, people who have these qualities are really in an envious position. They describe the kind of society that exists when we live according to these values – a place of truth and love, of compassion and justice, of peace, freedom and sharing. The general message is that those are really blessed when they know their dependence on God and commit themselves totally to the Way that Christ invites them to follow. The Beatitudes are expressed in positive terms. They also express not just actions but attitudes. In a way, they can never be fully observed. No matter how well we try to observe them, we can always go further. They leave no room for self-satisfaction. The Beatitudes are a true and reliable recipe for sainthood.

“Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children,” the Second Reading reminds us today. Saints are not self-made people. They are people who have responded generously to the love of God showered on them. And the completion of that love is to be invited to share life with God forever in the life to come.

Today's feast is first of all an occasion for great thanksgiving. It is altogether reasonable to think that many of our family, relatives and friends who have gone before us are being celebrated today.
