FROM PARISH TO MISSION AND THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS 2021 – 2023

Facilitators Will Visit Our Parish on Tuesday 16 November at 7pm
The Listening sessions will last 1hr 30min starting at 7.00pm. (Doors open at 6.30pm)
Prior to the Synodal 'listening session' meeting with the facilitators, there will be a short meeting after Mass on Sunday 14 November to help prepare for Tuesday 16 November

Do come along to the meeting Tuesday 16 November. If you are unable to attend or if you would rather engage with the process online, you can complete an online questionnaire at https://www.dioceseofleeds.org.uk/parish-to-mission-survey.

The Ten Questions taken from the preparatory document (Synod 2021 - 2023). The facilitators will guide you through the following questions.

- **I. The journeying companions** As we journey together let us look around. Who are you on the journey with and what persons or groups are marginalised and why?
- **II. Listening** How might our local Church better listen to lay people (and especially young people and women) and minorities and those who are not respected?
- **III. Speaking out** How can everybody be encouraged to communicate appropriately what is important to them?
- IV. Celebrating How might I be better able to participate in Mass and other liturgies?
- **V. Co-responsible in the mission** How can each Baptised person become a "missionary disciple", revealing Christ to others through their words and deeds?
- **VI. Dialogue in Church and society** How might we improve our conversations within our diocesan family and also outside of it, (for example with people of different faiths, those who have no faith and those who have particular roles and duties in society)?
- **VII. With the other Christian denominations** Are our relations with our Christian brothers and sisters good? How might they be improved?
- **VIII. Authority and participation** How might we develop teamwork and a sense of coresponsibility in our local Church?
- **IX. Discerning and deciding** How might we improve the process of decision-making in our local Church, so that we truly listen and recognise that the Holy Spirit can speak through each one of us?
- **X. Forming ourselves in synodality** What formation is necessary within the local Church if we are to become better at listening to one another and sharing our insights with one another?

FIELD NOTES We live in a very image conscious society. How we are seen is very important. Scribes and Pharisees are presented as very image conscious. In fact, scribes, as interpreters of the Law, were deeply respected for their great learning. They wore long white robes as a sign of their devotion to the law. People were supposed to stand in their presence and greet them with titles like "Master" or "Teacher". The problem was that they began to feel that such respect was a right. The respect that was shown for God's law, they began to arrogate for themselves.

By contrast the saints and especially Mother Teresa did the opposite. Mother Teresa coming to visit a school in Hong Kong, wore an old cardigan over her habit and on her feet an ageing pair of leather sandals. A couple of weeks later she was back in India receiving the Templeton Award it was April 24, 1973. Photographs showed her shaking hands and wearing the same cardigan and the same sandals. The queen did not seem to mind or probably even notice. Mother Teresa, founder of India's Missionaries of Charity, was recognized by the inaugural Templeton Prize (six years before she received the Nobel Peace Prize) for her extraordinary efforts to help the homeless and neglected children of Kolkata. Perhaps we feel that Mother Teresa was different and could get away with it. And, of course, she was different and that is the point. But why should we be different from her?

In the gospel of Saint Mark provides us with another great woman of faith. The gospel a bridge between the teaching life of Jesus and the Passion narrative which is soon to follow. This widow, who gives up everything she has to God and puts all her trust in God, is a symbol of Jesus himself who will soon make the total offering of his life, his work and his good name to his Father out of love for us. This beautiful story is meant to be also a summation of all Jesus' teaching about discipleship. He wishes us to identify with this widow. The widow had a greatness which they totally lacked it is this sort of heroic work

which brings about real change among those we live and served and will hopefully continue to inspire others to do the same. The question is, can we do the same?
