The Ten Questions taken from the preparatory document (Synod 2021 - 2023). The facilitators will guide you through the following questions.

I. The journeying companions As we journey together let us look around. Who are you on the journey with and what persons or groups are marginalised and why?

- **II. Listening** How might our local Church better listen to lay people (and especially young people and women) and minorities and those who are not respected?
- **III. Speaking out** How can everybody be encouraged to communicate appropriately what is important to them?
- IV. Celebrating How might I be better able to participate in Mass and other liturgies?
- **V. Co-responsible in the mission** How can each Baptised person become a "missionary disciple", revealing Christ to others through their words and deeds?
- **VI. Dialogue in Church and society** How might we improve our conversations within our diocesan family and also outside of it, (for example with people of different faiths, those who have no faith and those who have particular roles and duties in society)?

VII. With the other Christian denominations

Are our relations with our Christian brothers and sisters good? How might they be improved?

VIII. Authority and participation

How might we develop teamwork and a sense of co-responsibility in our local Church?

IX. Discerning and deciding

How might we improve the process of decision-making in our local Church, so that we truly listen and recognise that the Holy Spirit can speak through each one of us?

X. Forming ourselves in synodality

What formation is necessary within the local Church if we are to become better at listening to one another and sharing our insights with one another?

FIELD NOTES 'For everything there is a season, a time for every matter under heaven.' (Ecclesiastes 3.1) We know that we are children of time by the way we set our clocks and watches so that we will know what hour it is. We know larger amounts of time by measuring the months, years, centuries. We also know the seasons of Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter. And we know that today it is time for remembrance.

On this November day we pray for those who have died fighting - principally I and II WWs but also in subsequent conflicts - we remember those who were ready to put themselves in the firing line. It seems fitting that we remember today also all those others who died in war: in bombing raids, those civilians who lost their lives simply because they were in the wrong place at the wrong time.

How do we remember? We remember with silence the true language of remembrance. It is the recognition that in order to do justice to what has happened, to do justice to the cost of war – its sacrifice and shame - we do not need to tell another story. Rather we need to be silent together. We need to stop to be still and to be silent.

We remember not to allow the past to capture us in its worst moments but to build us up for the future. We remember not only to honour the fallen, but to raise them in our hearts and to promise to live lives worthy of their sacrifice.

Jesus knew the power of remembrance - On the day before he was to suffer, he took bread in his holy and venerable hands, and with eyes raised to heaven to you, O God, his almighty Father, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, he took the chalice, he said the blessing and gave the chalice to his disciples, saying, DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME.

For of such simple things is the kingdom of God – of such remembrance comes the forgiveness of sins, the cleansing of our hearts and souls of our faults and failures and the all-too-painful realities that accuse us when we think on the qualities of others, and judge ourselves by the sacrifice made by those who cannot be here because they have given their all. Let us acknowledge with gratitude those who died, and then turn again to life - the life which they in their deaths helped to safeguard.
