

PEACE SUNDAY "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace" (Is 52:7) Today, 16 January, is PEACE SUNDAY and this year Pope Francis asks us to think about 'Education, work and dialogue between generations: tools for building lasting peace'.
