WORLD DAY OF PRAYER SERVICE 2024 This worldwide, ecumenical, women-lead service will be held at Good Shepherd on Friday 01 March at 1:30pm. LENT - In Lent we pray, fast, and give. Can you make three Lenten promises?

- 1. Decide a time to **pray** each day. (Get your copy of My Day by Day Lent)
- 2. Choose to **fast** from something you enjoy throughout Lent.
- 3. Think of a way you can give your time to someone else each week of Lent.

PRAY EVERY DAY THIS LENT — download for free the Hallow app - Very high-quality design. Learn from theologians and religious leaders and meditate alongside your other brothers and sisters in Christ. The app is free to download and there are two options for using it. There is a free version that does not require any payment for Hallow and then there is an optional paid subscription. Hallow is priced at \$9.99 per month or \$69.99 per year (or about \$6 per month) that is billed once for full access to the content. There is a family plan for \$119.99/year that grants access to the Hallow subscription for up to six family and friends. Listen to Bible in a Year and Catechism in a Year with Fr. Mike. Pray the Rosary and Stations with Bishop Barron.

MOUNT ST JOSEPH'S CARE HOME UPDATE due to the presence of Reinforced Aerated Autoclaved Concrete (RAAC) the Little Sisters of the Poor have had to make the difficult decision to close the Mount St Joseph's Care Home in Leeds. Over the next few months all 62 residents will be found new homes and more than 90 staff face redundancy. The Little Sisters are facing unexpected costs upwards of £500,000 to keep everyone safe until all residents are re-homed. Raymond was Director of the Jesuit Institute - South Africa, working to bring a faith perspective to debates on social issues. He also designed and facilitated courses in values-based leadership. He then became head of Communities for CAFOD, working with Catholic parishes and schools across South Africa.
