**CHURCH WEEKEND** We had a wonderful time at the church weekend. Building relationships, good food, fun and games, quiet times and reflection. We studied the story of Elisha and the widow's oil. 'What have you got'. 2 Kings 4:

- \*God only takes what we offer to Him.
- \*God takes what we have, however insignificant we feel, and does great things with it.
- \* God meets us in our weakness.

Emma wrote a beautiful meditation on this which sums up our reflections perfectly:

## "How can I help? What have you got?

There was a woman, a woman in desperate need. Her husband had died, she was in debt, she needed to sell her sons to slavery. Any one of those things would have been awful, she had all three.

Elisha spoke to her on behalf of God. How can I help you? What can I do for you? When we are in need we turn to God for help. We ask God for things that we need - we all have many different types of need - we pray - but it's often one sided - what do I need? But Elisha did not ask what the widow needed, he asked, 'How can I help you?".

You may have heard the phrase - Ask and you will receive

God asks every one of us - What do you want me to do for you?

Through prayer we ask for his wisdom and guidance.

We put our faith and trust in God that he will provide salvation, give us forgiveness.

We pray for solutions, we ask for practicalities - a better job, more money, a safe home And God knows us, like he knew the widow, he knows what we need - but what does God need?

Instead of asking what he can do for us why don't we ask, 'What can we do for him?'.

God wants us.

God wants to work through us.

So what have you got? What can you offer?

We may feel we have little to offer, but however small God can still use it. The widow only had a small jar of olive oil - so small, but it was big enough.

When we offer God the little we have he can transform it into great things, greater than we can ever imagine.

So what have you got?

Gifts, natural talents, skills, experience, homes, money, possessions, friends, family.

We can offer these things to God - everything we have is given to us by God - offer it back to him to use and to serve him.

In our lives - in our church

It can sometimes be uncomfortable - you can feel a bit silly. Sometimes we may feel foolish telling other people about God. Now imagine how the widow felt asking her neighbours for jars! What did her neighbours think of her?

And why did she do it? Because she trusted God, she had faith. She listened and obeyed.

And what did God do? He met her needs and did far, far more.

God's love has NO limits, what he can give us has no boundaries

So how much can you give?

Can you give yourself, give all you have, your time, your talents and let God work though you?

Just remember the widow, she had little but with faith she just 'kept pouring' and God kept providing

And in just the same way God will keep pouring his love and peace and holy spirit into us and our lives.

She just kept pouring - and when all the jars were filled she stopped

But there was no limit imposed by God. He would have filled 1 jar or a million jars.

Whatever she brought to him

So think, what do we bring to him? What have you got? Remember the more you invest in God the greater the rewards.

Whenever we make ourselves and our own resources available to God he will fill us , like he filled those jars.

So present yourself like a vessel, pray to him, let him use you for his service.

Be faithful to God and he will pour his oil - his grace and mercy on your life

So be open to God - don't limit yourself

If you only give a little, pray a little, attempt a little you will get a little, hear little and accomplish little

So ask yourself - What have you got?"
