The Importance of Confession in Preparation for Christmas and Throughout the Year As we approach the Advent season, a time rich with expectation and hope, the Church invites us to deepen our spiritual preparations for the celebration of Christ's birth. This year, Advent Confession will take place at St Mary's on Saturday, 14 December 2024, from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. This sacred opportunity calls us to reflect on the transformative power of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

I warmly invite all parishioners to take part in this Advent Confession on 14 December. Let us embrace this time of penance and grace as we ready ourselves to celebrate the birth of our Saviour, renewed in spirit and heart.

CALDERDALE HOSPITAL Because of modern data regulations it is not always guaranteed that those who work in hospitals or nursing homes will know that you are a Catholic and would like a visit from a priest and to receive of the sacraments. As such, there are cards at the back of church for you to take away and keep in your wallet and purse. You need to sign and date them and keep them on your person. They state explicitly that you are a Catholic and give permission for a priest to be called to you in an emergency. There are plenty of cards available so please feel free to take them for family and friends who may wish to make use of them as well.

NEW MASS BOOKS As you are probably already aware from the beginning of Advent this year, we will be moving to a new lectionary which will mean a whole new set of Mass books. The previous sets are now outdated and effectively useless. We have hopefully got someone who will take them away to be recycled however we wondered if people would like to have a set at home- the readings themselves have not changed but the new ones are more authentic to the original texts. These will be available on the 01 Sunday of Advent, they will be on the spare chairs underneath the Peace window, they will only be there for 2 weeks and then will be recycled.

CATHOLIC FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS In the ebb and flow of life, there are some topics we instinctively shy away from, and one of those is the inevitable journey towards our own end. Though the thought of our mortality may be daunting, a small gesture of preparation can make a world of difference, particularly to those who mourn our passing.

By engaging in a heart-to-heart conversation with our loved ones about our final wishes, we can offer them comfort and clarity in a time of grief. Consider discussing preferences for your Requiem Mass or funeral Service, your chosen Hymns, and Scripture Readings. These intimate details will not only reflect your personal faith journey but will also provide solace and direction to those you leave behind.

Once decisions have been made, we recommend penning down these arrangements and placing them alongside your important documents in a safe location. In doing so, you provide a beacon of guidance when it's needed most, ensuring that, even in absence, your love and thoughtfulness continues to guide and comfort.
